

## **At a meeting of Eardington Parish Council held on 7th November, 2016**

**Minutes** The minutes of the previous meeting, having been circulated were taken as read, confirmed and signed as a correct record

**Matters arising from those minutes** The defibrillator had been installed at the Village Hall and a successful, although poorly attended, training evening had been held.  
b) Boot Camp Mr.Hodgkins had sent details of the history of the Boot Camp in Lincolnshire where it operated for some time without planning permission. All Councillors had received a copy and it was agreed that further action would be taken if there were complaints from residents.

The tenants had become abusive when it was explained to them that they must allow free passage to all walkers. It was agreed that the owner of the ground - Hayden Woolley, should be informed of the position.

**Planning** Mr.Gibbons declared an interest in the following application but was asked to explain his proposals before he left the room.

Planning Application 16/04795/FUL Conversion and extension of existing two storey coach house building into living space, erection of a link extension and associated internal works and the erection of a single storey garage building at The Grange, Eardington, Bridgnorth
